

We have provided the well known Primary & Prep School Spelling Bee Competition in the hands of the youngsters. The app is sponsored by Grace Kennedy Money Services (GKMS) and Western Union (WU) and was built by Bazzle Amusement.

The KCNK Little Bee Game can be played anywhere without an internet connection, with two learning modes and the competition mode. Each mode has 10 levels as words progressively get larger towards the end. Each Level has 15 or more words to learn. The words of a particular level are the same words for each mode.

In Settings, the Student can enter their name, age, parish and school. They can select from Learning Mode 1, Learning Mode 2 or Competition Mode.

Learning Mode 1:

Students can learn to spell a word by taping each letter in the word, from left to right, (from the first letter to the last). The KCNK Little Bee app says the name of the letter out loud so the children can say along. If the student makes a mistake, they can tap on the mistake to undo it. If the student wants to hear the word again, they can tap on the little bee at the top left of the screen.

In this mode the student has to spell correctly each word to move on to the next word, and correctly spell all words to complete the level. The student can redo any level at any time. Students must complete early levels before starting later levels.

Learning Mode 2:

Students are given the letters of each word in jumbled (mixed up) fashion, and are asked to spell the called word correctly. If the student makes a mistake, they can tap on the mistake to undo it. If the student wants to hear the word again, they can tap on the little bee at the top left of the screen. In this mode the student has to spell correctly each word to move on to the next word, and correctly spell all words to complete the level. The student can redo any level at any time. Students must complete early levels before starting later levels.



Competition Mode:

Students are given the letters of each word in jumbled (mixed up) fashion, with extra letters added (thrown in) and are asked to spell the called word correctly. The student is timed for each word, and each time is added to their total for the level. Students are given 10 random words from the pool of words for the level. Students should aim to complete each level in the shortest amount of time possible. The leader board (main page) shows how much time was spent on each level.

Students can reset the game and start again on the Settings page. While playing, students should wait until a letter has been finish being called before selecting the next letter. Students and Parents can feel free to screen capture their leader board to send to their teachers.



Treasurer did an overview of the clubs account balances as of July 31, 2022.



Remember your key message. Above all, make sure the prospect understands what Kiwanis is about. The key message: Kiwanis is a global organization of members, clubs and partners who are dedicated to improving the world one child and one community at a time.

Be observant. If meeting at their home or office, look around during your visit. Take note of items such as wall plaques, photos, awards, etc., so you can engage prospects based on their interests.

Listen. Find out what their interests are and connect them to club projects when possible. Talk with them, not at them.

Take an application. Complete the application with the prospect and ask for payment. If they can't pay at that moment, offer other options for picking up or receiving payment. Know how much to ask for and how the money is used.


Take a notebook. After the meeting, write down anything you consider important. A prospect who doesn't join today might join later — and your information will be useful then.


Follow up. Make a phone call or send a note thanking them for their time, regardless of whether they agreed to join. Either way, make sure they know they're on your mind.

Don't give up! A "no" may not be permanent. Invite them to a service project if the club has one coming up and connect with them on Facebook or LinkedIn. Post photos of activities on social media. Make sure to share your contact information.


